A RAY OF LIGHT



Instructions: Read about Charlotte E. Ray's life and match the cause to the correct effect.



Charlotte E. Ray is known as the first African-American **lawyer** in the history of the United States and was the first woman to actually practice law! Imagine how hard it is to be the first at something. Even winning first place in a **competition** is hard – but when you are the first person to do something, most times it is not an easy road. That is true for Charlotte E. Ray too!



She was born into a family of 7 kids on January 13, 1850. After the **Civil War** she started going to school, one of the few schools that girls could **attend**. A woman named Mrytilla Miller created the school because she was first a teacher at a different school that did not allow girls. Remember at that time women did not have many rights, like Black people, and had to face many challenges to get an education. After Charlotte finished school she started teaching but she really wanted to be a lawyer. To get into Howard she couldn't even use her real name because colleges were not wanting women to attend.

After she graduated, she made even more history because she was one of the first women that was able to take the **bar**. After she passed she opened her own law firm. She was a lawyer for a few years but many people did not want a woman lawyer, especially a Black woman, so it was hard for her to keep business and she had to close. She worked as a teacher after that and was married later. She never had any children but she created a **legacy** that is so amazing now we have thousands of Black women that are lawyers.

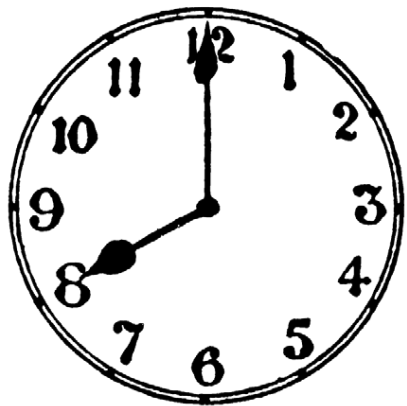
Evidence #1	There are crumbs on the floor and there ain't any more chocolate chip cookies left.

Evidence #6	Jayla had a stomach ache, and she gets stomach aches when she eats too many sweets.



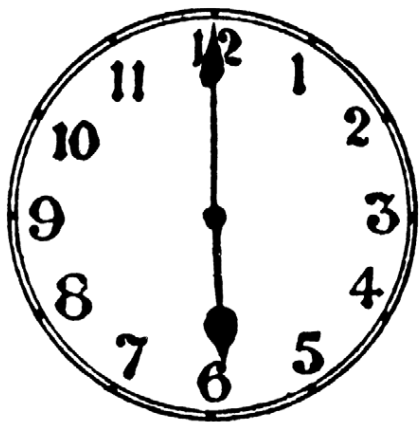
