
Mary J Wilson was born in Baltimore, Maryland on January 2nd. She graduated with a **high school diploma** and realized she had a huge love of animals. She started out working at the Maryland Zoo in 1961. Wilson was the first Black senior **zookeeper** in Baltimore.

Most women who were working at the zoo at that time either worked with birds or baby animals, but Wilson worked with **mammals** like gorillas and elephants.

One of the people she worked with said that elephants were her favorite. described her as **fearless**.


She loved her work so much that sometimes she even brought work home with her. She would care for the baby animals at her home - like monkeys, gorillas, and snakes. There are many stories about her getting animals back in their cages, even really **dangerous** animals like leopards. Her daughter heard a story about

a time where she was able to get a bear back into the right place. The door was left open and the bear walked through. Mary J Wilson stood there with apples calling his name, Junior, until he walked back into his habitat. She did not show fear but instead stood there with just apples.



She worked at the zoo for 38 years and retired in 1999.

Years later, her daughter was the first Black zookeeper at Omaha city zoo. Mary J Wilson died of Coronavirus in 2020 but the memories, her passion, and the impact of her work live on.




HABITATS









GLOSSARY

Dangerous - able or likely to cause injury, pain, harm, etc.
