

THE MAN WHO WAS CALLED MANDELA

Once upon a time, there was a young child called Rolihlahla Mandela. He was the child of a man who was the principal **counsellor** to the king.

After his father died he was a ward at the great palace. He heard many stories of elders who were fighting for freedom, and hearing those stories inspired him to want to do the same thing.

The young boy soon became a young man, and that inspiration never went away.

He began his college experience at the University College of Fort Hare, but he got kicked out of school for joining a student protest.


He became very active in fighting for freedom and all people. During that time apartheid was happening and Blacks and Whites were not treated equally. In 1944 he joined the African National Congress and was engaged in resistance. He went to **trial** for **treason** but he did not end up getting charged. The African National Congress was later banned, and Nelson Mandela faced many challenges. In 1967 he was **accused** of going against the government and spent 27 years in prison.

That did not stop his work and **dedication**, and when he got out he continued to fight to end apartheid. Years later he won the Nobel Peace Prize and he became the first Black president of



South Africa.

That young boy turned leader and **icon** taught the world that no matter what happens, you can always make your dream come true.

The Nobel Peace Prize is one of the most important honors and awards that anyone can receive. The prize was started after inventor and entrepreneur Alfred Nobel left his fortune to recognize and reward people many advances in society. There are actually six categories; <u>peace</u>, <u>literature</u>, <u>physics</u>, <u>chemistry</u>, <u>economics</u>, and <u>medicine</u>. The winners are chosen every year and they receive lots of recognition and about 1 million dollars (US). To get a Nobel prize a person has to be doing really amazing work to create or discover something that will change the world!

Counsellor - a person who provides advice as a job : a person who counsels people

Inspiration - something that makes someone want to do something or that gives someone an idea about what to do or create

Trial - a formal meeting in a court in which evidence about crimes, disagreements, etc., is presented to a judge and often a jury so that decisions can be made according to the law **Treason** - the crime of trying to overthrow your country's government or of helping your country's enemies during war

Accused - a person who is charged with a crime

Dedication - a feeling of very strong support for, or loyalty to someone or something

Icon - a person who is very successful and admired
