

## MAKING MOVIE MAGIC

Instructions: Read the sections about Ruth Carter's life, then answer the questions using the images to help guide your answers.


Have you ever played dress up and made an amazing costume for one of your adventures? Well, how about doing that as a career? Not actually designing for yourself but for actors in a movie? Well, Ruth Carter does just that. She is a movie costume designer who is especially known for winning an Academy Award in 2019 for Marvel's Black Panther, making her the first Black person to win for the best costume design category! She had also been nominated for many awards for her costumes before then.

Ruth Carter was born in Springfield, Massachusetts. For a short time, she thought about an acting career - but after not getting the part in a few auditions she was asked to do some costume design, because she could sew. She then fell in love with costume design while she was a student at Hampton University (an HBCU in Hampton, Virginia). Spike Lee, a Black male filmmaker known for his movies about the Black experience, gave Ruth Carter her first opportunity when she worked in his film School Daze. She worked with Lee on many films after that.

Ruth Carter has designed thousands of costumes for over 60 films. She loves using them to help the films, the characters, and stories really come alive. She believes that costumes tell important and powerful stories just like films do. Her work is very important to her - and one of the reasons why she is so successful is that she takes the time to do research and to talk to historians when designing her costumes.

## KNOWLEDGE + CREATIVITY = STYLE

Fashion designers actually use a good amount of math in their work. Think about creating an outfit from start to finish - you will need math to measure the right amount of fabric, to sew or cut in the right places for the look you want, to determine your cost for materials, to work out how much money you will make - and so much more. In the task below you will answer some questions that a fashion designer might have! Do you have the right skills and ideas to create a winning style?

1. You are designing a look for a red carpet event and now you are ready to buy some fabric. You cut a piece of fabric that is $\mathbf{8}$ feet long and 10 feet wide - how much is that in square feet??
2. Now that you have the fabric, you need to find out how much it is going to cost you. The price of the fabric is $\$ 2$ per square foot. How much will the amount of fabric you need cost you?
3. You have paid for your fabric and you have a budget of $\$ 200$. Did you meet your budget? Why or why not?
