

## THE RACE OF A LIFETIME

Instructions: Read the timeline below to learn more about Wendell Scott's life and achievements and then answer the questions below.

Wendell Oliver Scott was one of the first African-American drivers in NASCAR, which is the **professional** race car driving organization. He was also the first African American to win the highest **competition**, which is the Grand National Series.

1921	Wendell Scott was born in Danville, Virginia.
1935	He started driving when he was just 14. He would help his family by going to the store and he also drove to church.
1943	He began his career in the <b>army</b> and he worked in cars while was there. After he left the army he worked on cars and soon become one of the most well-known <b>mechanics</b> in Virginia. He also worked as a taxi driver.
1947	He started racing for fun and more and more people began to notice his skills.
MAR 4, 1961	He tookj part in his first major NASCAR race after many <b>challenges</b> .
DEC 1, 1963	Scott became the first African American to win the Sprint Cup <b>Division</b> , the top division in NASCAR. But he was not given that <b>title</b> at first. It took several days for him to be named the winner because at that time some people didn't want a Black man to race or win.
1973	Scott got into a car crash and <b>retired.</b>
1990	Wendell Scott died of spinal cancer.




